Vision of a multipart cross border pilot

Community that can do eBusiness without bilateral agreements

Support for more than one infrastructure

Participants from more than 6 countries

The pilot is based on the workshop specifications

Support for a wide range of procurement including

- Billing only

- Order to invoice

- Catalogue exchange

- eTendering

Participants from many different roles



Infrastructure in the pilot

Based on a common replicated registry

- Tells the endpoint of the pilot member

- Tells what kind of transaction (profile) the member can do

The infrastructure can be based on VANS, banking network or internet based, ideally all three.

Infrastructures are connected by gateways

Common understanding of use of signatures

- Tender manager

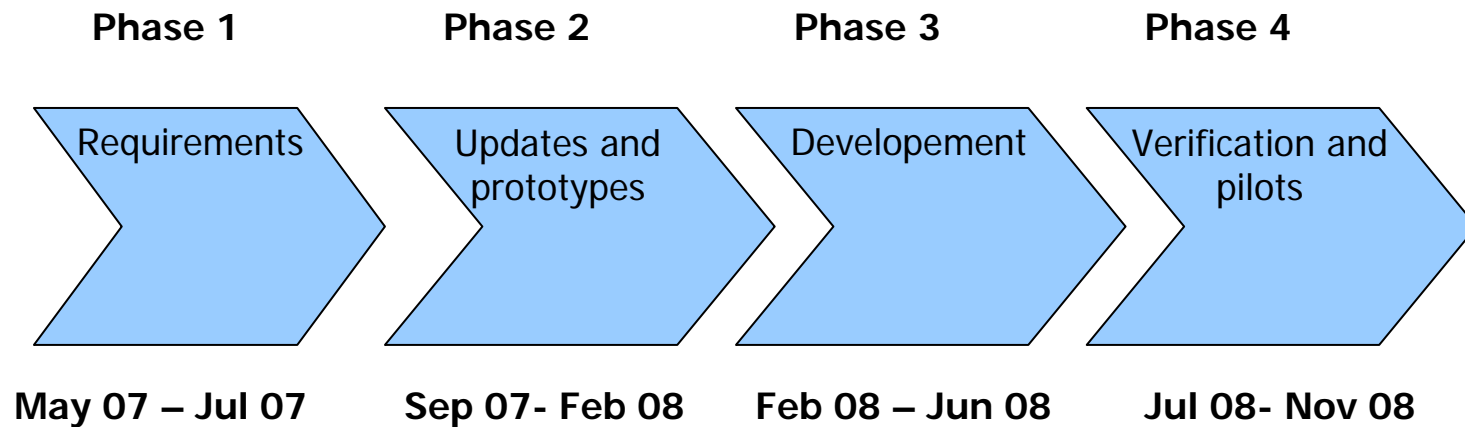

Timeline



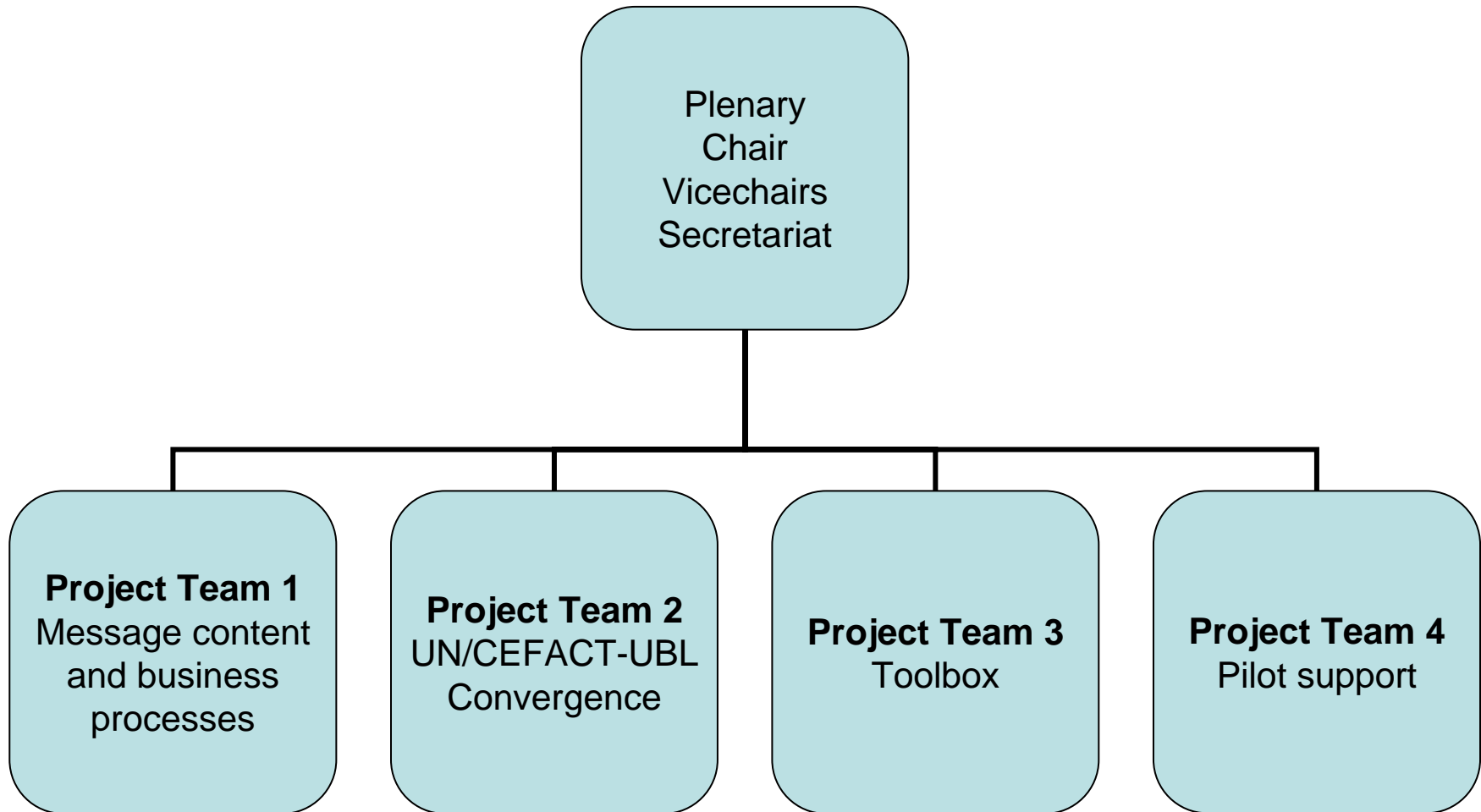

Organization





Funding

In 2007 the expenses are 100% paid by the workshop members.

In 2008 the expenses are 90% paid by the commission.
